COMMUNITIES MENTAL HEALTH & WELLBEING FUND FOR ADULTS



Our Year 3 of the fund closed for applications on the 23rd of November 2023, we received a staggering 65 applications totaling £603,000.

As a TSI we have £278,000 of funding available to us from the £15 million Scottish Government funding. We have started the process of thoroughly scoring every application. To oversee this process we have a local advisory panel who have a wealth of experience both professionally and lived of mental health and wellbeing within the third sector community. This panel will have the final say on the application approval. The decision making process will not be an easy one! We have received applications from a wide variety of third sector groups making a big impact in East Dunbartonshire.

We are pleased to see more applications for grassroots organisations, including some small unconstituted groups. Themes coming through from the applications are focusing on long term health condition or disability, Diagnosed mental illness and supporting women in the community. We are seeing more peer to peer support and group activities tackling loneliness and isolation. It has been good to see more projects focusing on inclusivity and addressing inequality.

Applicants will be emailed a final decision by 13th of February 2024 and funds will be paid out by end of March 2024, or before if possible. If you have any questions about the fund please contact joni.mitchell@edva.org.

Scottish Government – Local Support Fund Micro Grants

LSF Micro seeks to offer financial security for grassroots and community-based groups delivering frontline services to support people who or have used drugs, people in recovery and/or families affected by someone else's drug use. The National Lottery Community Fund – Scotland

BBC Children in Need (CIN) Grants Programme

CIN grant programme now comprises two separate funding streams: core costs funding and project grants. Each stream offers up to three years funding for organisations working with children and young people aged 18 years and under, who address their challenges, and build their skills and resilience. Grants of no more than £40,000 per annum, or £120,000 over three years are available.

The Robertson Trust

Grant applications are assessed a rolling basis for charities with an income of up to £2million that address poverty and/or trauma in their communities. The Aviva Community Fund aims to build stronger and more resilient local communities, and every application by a charity, CIC or community group is judged on improving either climate action or personal financial wellbeing. Match funding is offered for each donation, with a cap of up to £50,000. The Turtleton Charitable Trust

The Trust makes grants to charities which work to advance arts, culture and heritage: the Trustees particularly favour heritage and the visual arts, but other aspects of the arts and culture will be considered. The vast majority of grants are made in this field. The Trustees will also fund a small number of projects which provide support of the disadvantaged and the advancement of education. Minimum award is £5,000; maximum award is £25,000

Young Person's Guarantee Programme

The Young Person's Guarantee (YPG) is a programme that is run through EDVA to help young people build confidence, reduce isolation and start some volunteering. The goal after they have volunteered for a few months is to look at supporting them into employment or further education.

Through this year we have had many different projects running such as gardening at the back of our office, a walking group and our EDVA Project on a Tuesday. This is just an informal catch up where the young people choose what they want to do. It can be playing monopoly or other games, speaking about confidence or anxiety or anything at all that the young people suggest that day.

Most recently the young people had a stall at St Mary's for their Christmas Fayre which worked out really well. They baked and along with some donations from the public, EDVA staff and sold their cakes. They also held raffles which all worked out well.

Hopefully moving forward there will be some more places for our young people to visit, to sell their cakes and practice their baking skills.

This year has been a great success and I would like to thank all the young people for their hard work and for trying out all the new things on offer through this programme.

I am really proud of all the young people and how they are starting to believe in themselves and move on in their lives.

The Young Person's Guarantee is aimed at 16-24 year olds who are not in full time education or employment and who would like to build confidence and move on in their lives.


